# GCSE Number Grades

GCSEs are graded 1-9, with 9 the highest.

Grade 7 and above would be the equivalent to the old A-A\* grades.

Grade 4 is roughly equivalent to the old grade 'C', considered to be a 'pass'.

All courses are 'linear' – exams take place at the end of the course.

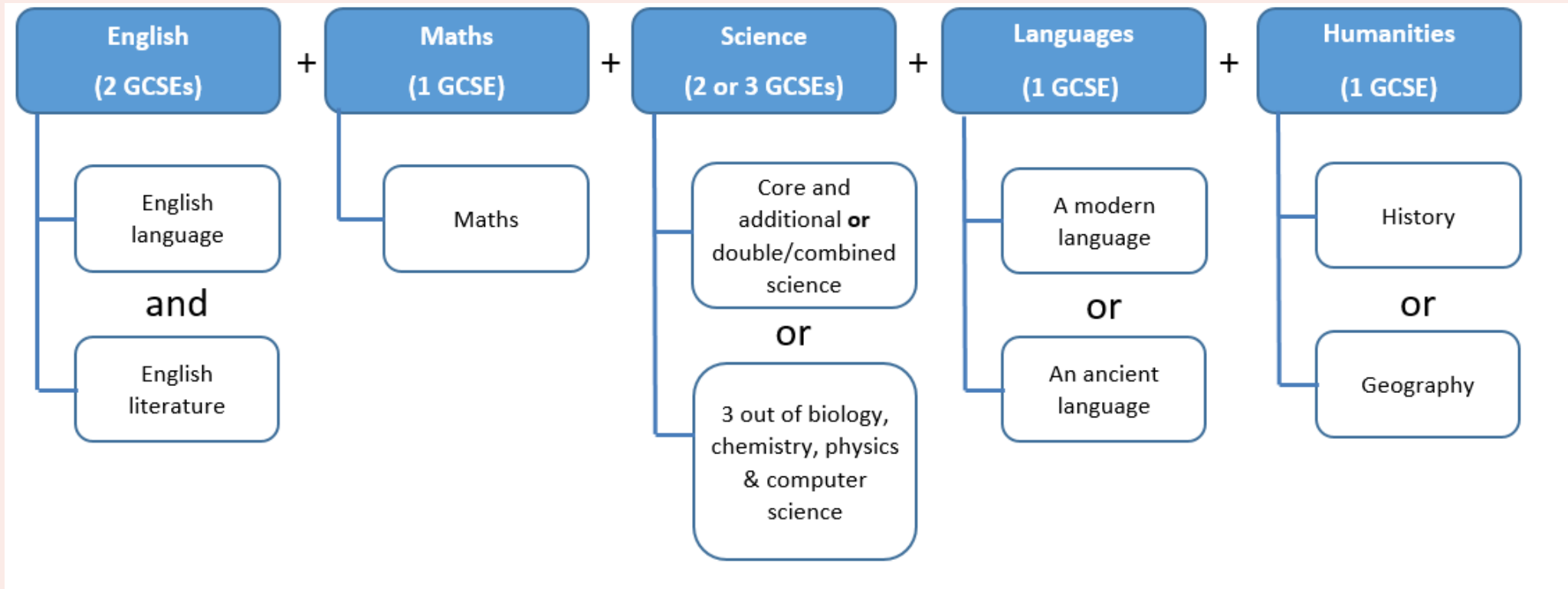
A small number of courses have non-examined assessment (NEA). This is assessed internally by teachers and then submitted to exam boards to count towards the final grade alongside exam result.

# English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

The EBacc comprises the core academic subjects that the vast majority of young people should have the opportunity to study to age 16.

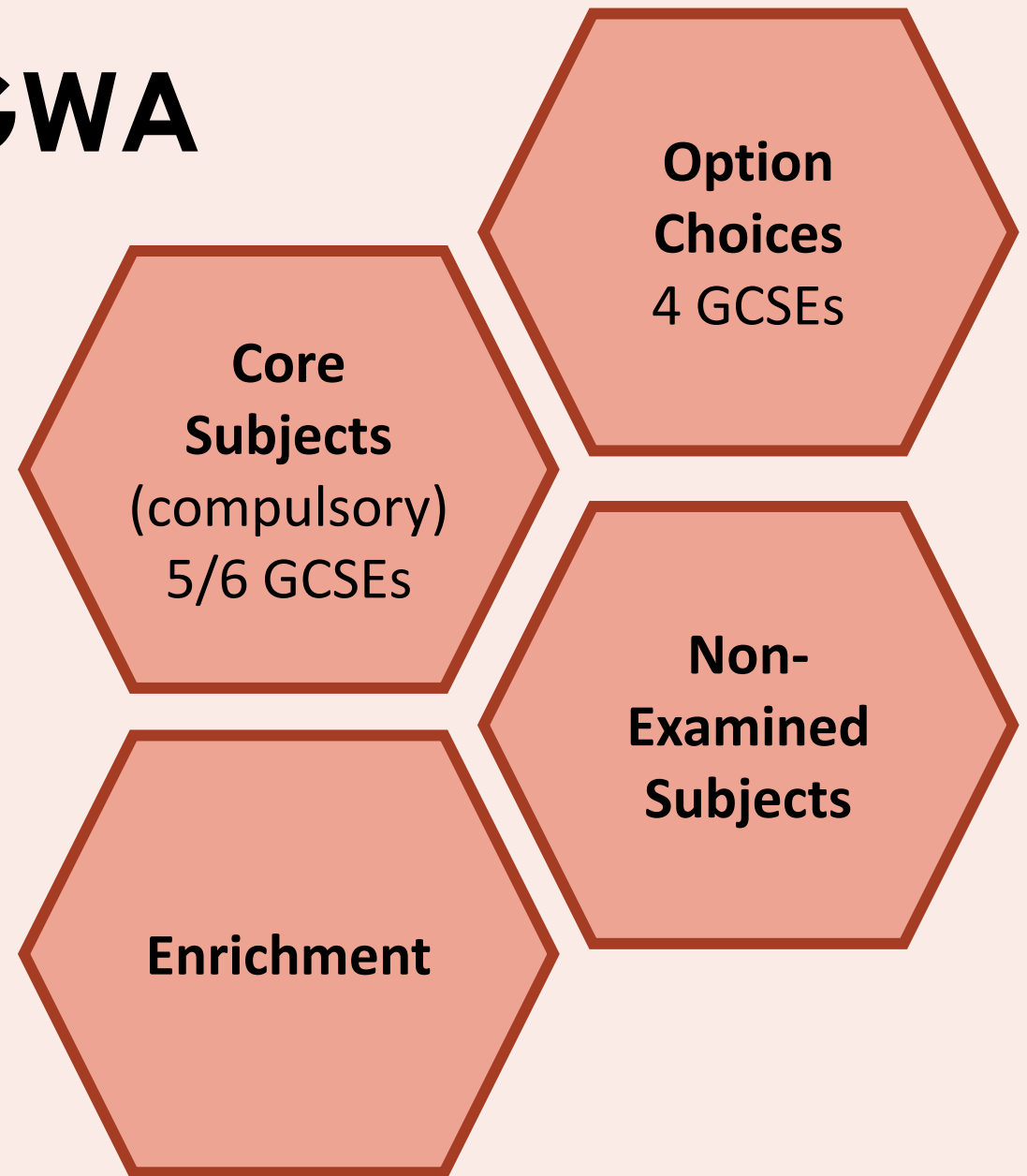
Studying EBACC subjects at GWA is not compulsory, but it is highly recommended.



# KS4 Curriculum at GWA

In KS4 students will study towards 9 or 10 GCSEs or vocational qualifications depending on their pathway.

Part of the curriculum is compulsory and part allows for students to choose the subjects they wish to study.



# Core Curriculum at GWA

All students follow the core curriculum until the end of year 11. The courses, the qualifications that they lead to and the teaching time are shown below. The core curriculum gives all students the opportunity to achieve up to 6 GCSEs.

# Core Curriculum at GWA

In English students will study both GCSE English Literature and GCSE English Language. This means all students will achieve 2 GCSEs in English.

In science students will study towards either the GCSE Combined Science qualification or separate science qualifications.

In GCSE Combined Science students will achieve a double grade worth 2 GCSEs.

In GCSE Biology, Chemistry & Physics students will achieve a separate grade for each qualification, so achieve 3 GCSEs.

The Science Faculty will enter students onto the courses they are best suited to – there is no option for students to make this choice.

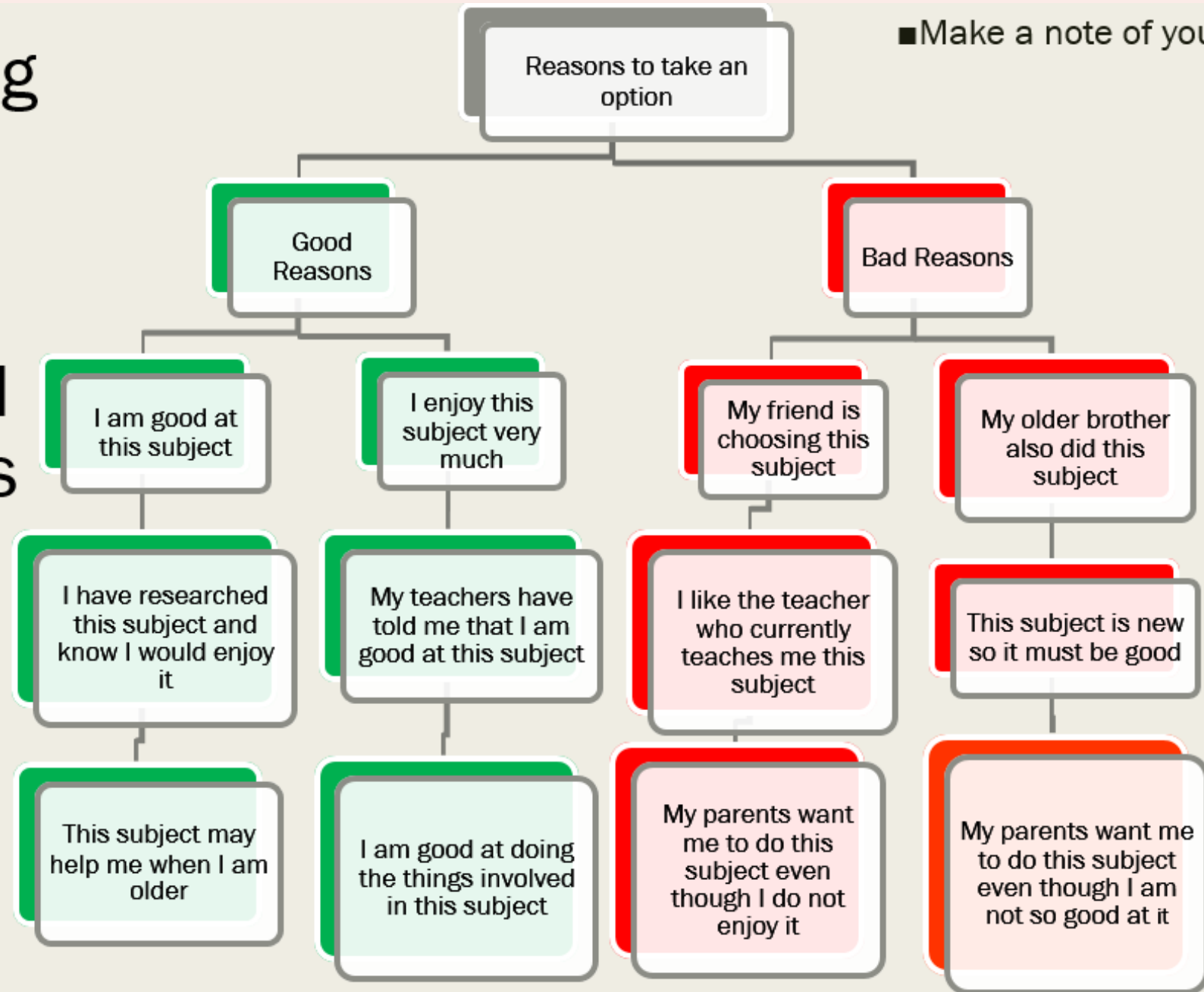


# How Do I Make My Choices?
