This gives students the opportunity to try subjects which they might want to opt for at GCSE and to spend more time doing subjects that they enjoy and find interesting.

It also gives them experience of making good choices so that they are better placed to make well informed decisions when they choose their GCSE subjects next year.



Y9 Curriculum at GWA

In Year 9 the curriculum is still made up from the same core subjects alongside 5 optional subjects.

Students choose to continue with 4 or 5 of the following KS3 subjects:

Computing Business Studies

Dance

PSHE

Combined Science

- Covers all of the program of study in biology, chemistry and physics
- Less content and shorter exams
- Accepted by all post-16 providers to access Alevel science courses (Grade 6-6 minimum requirement)

Separate Sciences

- Provides greater depth and greater challenge
- More content and longer exams
- The corresponding subject at grade 6 required as a minimum for A-level courses
- If you are in X1/X2/Y1/Y2, you will start the separate Science GCSE course.
- If you are in X3 or Y3, you will start on the combined Science course.

In both cases, this is so you can access the learning at an appropriate pace and level of challenge, helping you to achieve the best GCSE outcomes possible.

- Encourage your child not to just do what their friends are doing!
- Ignore the need to make a decision otherwise the decision will be made for each student
- Do it alone talk to people around you and have a think about what the consequences of each decision (good and bad) might be
- Forget... we are here to help you!


How Do I Make My Choices?


