<u>Page 1—Front cov</u>er


Use your creative skills to design the front cover for your magazine. You need to choose a design that would persuade someone to read it. Think about what would make your front cover stand out!

Do something kind for someone you care about. Volunteering your time is the greatest gift you can give to your school, community and the world.


Take notice



In this task, you **SHOULD TRY** to work with a partner who is starting Great Western Academy in September, but you can work on your own if preferred.


You should interview someone that you do not know well to find out about them.

Task 3—Product Review (of something you are interested in)


Plan your language (word/phrase choice). Look at the language used in examples

REMEMBER!

If you are giving advice you need to sound sensible, friendly, and positive.

Use phrases like "you could / should", "perhaps", "look on the bright side", "if that doesn't work, try...".

If you are replying to a letter make sure that you represent 'the voice' of the magazine well.
