- Time conjunctions




MFL

- Why did their civilization 'end'?

You can present this information how you like!





Science

Now you have arrived in Brazil; the Amazon rainforest stretches out before you.

There are many different species which live there – it is a unique ecosystem with a diverse range of plants and animals.

Many creatures in this habitat have adapted to the wet, humid environment it lives in. Your task is to research a creature who lives in the rainforest, then draw and label it with the features which help it survive the habitat.

Geography


Your penultimate stop is Nigeria. It has one of the largest river systems in the world, including the third largest delta.
